

Memory game with the alphabet

What you need:

- upper case and lower case letters in your alphabet. I put them in a frame that was 4,5 cm. x 4,5 cm.
- carton paper as thick as you can put in the laminator machine (so you can not see through the paper when upside down).
- laminator machine and plastic for it
- scissors

What to do:

- Make the upper case and lower case letters in your alphabet. I used a font called Skriftis Grunn. Print out on the thick carton paper and cut around the frames. Put in plastic and through the laminator machine. Cut again.

The game:

- Played like a memory game where you put the cards in a row with the letters facing down. You can use part of the letters if you think they are too many. The players then drag two cards and the aim is to pair upper case letter and lower case letter f.e. B-b F-f and so on. The winner is the one with most pairs.

Note:

- You can use the cards also to play bingo. The bingo reader has then f.e. all the lower case letters and the upper case letters are divided between the players (all with the same amount) The players then make a kind of a bingo card with their letters and the reader draws one card and reads the letter f.e. b. The players look for B and the one that has it takes the b and puts it on his B facing down. The winner is the one that first gets a bingo.
