

## **Pairing shapes and colors on the wall (for the youngest)**

### **What you need:**

- Shapes in different colors, two of each (here I used carton paper and made ring, triangle and square and had them 15x15 cm. I made yellow, red, green and blue)
- Book covering plastic
- Velcro straps (both parts)
- Laminatormachine and plastic
- Scissors

### **What to do:**

- Draw the shapes or make them in the computer and print. Cut the shapes and take one of each and use the book covering plastic to „glue“ them on the wall or a door. Remember to have this in a good height for the young kids that will be playing the game
- Velcro straps are glued in the middle of each shape
- The other half of the shapes are put in plastic and through the laminator machine. Cut and glue the other part of a velcro strap on the backside of each shape

### **The game:**

- Put the loose shapes on the floor and the kids pair them with the shapes and colors that are on the wall/door

### **Good to know:**

- Many kids develop this game. They start by putting the loose shapes on the shapes on the wall and are not aware that they are different and in different colors. Then they start to pair the right shapes without thinking about different colors. Finally they put the right shape on the right color
- You can have more shapes and more colors but in my preschool we use these three shapes in our work with the youngest kids
